**Langue** Anglais

**Acquis d'Apprentissage** The objective of the course is to give students an understanding of the EU laws and policies that regulate the internal market of the European Union, as well as an understanding of the relevant EU case law.

**Terminaux** The objective of this course is also to give a practical approach to the understanding of EU laws and policies by meeting professionals working in the EU Institutions and Bodies. On site visits in the EU Institutions/Bodies will complement the lectures.

**Contenu** The course will be divided into 4 modules:  
 • in the first module "The legal environment of the EU market", we will examine the main sources of EU law and how to find it.  
 • in the second module "The institutional environment of the EU market", we will examine the core structures composing the EU, i.e. their institutions and bodies and how the law-making process works.  
 • in the third module "The fundamental freedoms of the EU market", we will focus on the main principles that regulate various aspects of establishing and running a business within the European Union, i.e. the free movement of goods, the free movement of workers, the freedom to provide and receive services, the freedom of establishment, the free movement of capitals.  
 • in the fourth module "EU competition law", we will focus on the regulations and rules companies must abide when competing in the EU market.

**Méthode d'enseignement** Face-to-face sessions will take place at EPHEC in a classroom.  
 Some adaptations could be needed in function of the number of students following the course, possibility of online sessions.  
 There will be also on site visits in EU bodies and/or EU Institutions to give a practical approach to the lectures

**Acquis d'apprentissage intermédiaires et/ou spécifiques** At the end of this course, students will:  
 • have an understanding of how to navigate into EU legal sources and how to find them;  
 • understand relevant laws and regulations governing the EU internal market  
 • apply the fundamental principles of EU law within the EU legal framework  
 • understand the principles of free movement of goods, persons and services  
 • understand EU competition law
